Eddie Jackson (American football) Eddie Anthony Jackson (born March 25, 1984) is a former American football defensive end who played in the National Football League. He was signed by the Jacksonville Jaguars as an undrafted free agent in 2006. He played college football at Appalachian State University. Jackson also played for the Washington Redskins and New Orleans Saints. Early years Jackson attended Booker T. Washington High School in Tulsa, Oklahoma, where he was a letterwinner in football. He also played on the school's basketball team. College career Jackson played college football at Appalachian State University, and was a member of the Appalachian State Mountaineers football team from 2003 to 2005. He had seven sacks during his college career. Professional career Jackson signed with the Jacksonville Jaguars as an undrafted free agent on May 3, 2006. He was waived on August 30, 2006, but was re-signed on September 1. He was waived again on September 2, but was re-signed to the practice squad on September 6. He signed a reserve/future contract with the Jaguars on January 1, 2007. He was promoted to the active roster on December 1, 2007. He was waived during final cuts on August 30, 2008. He was re-signed to the practice squad on September 6.
